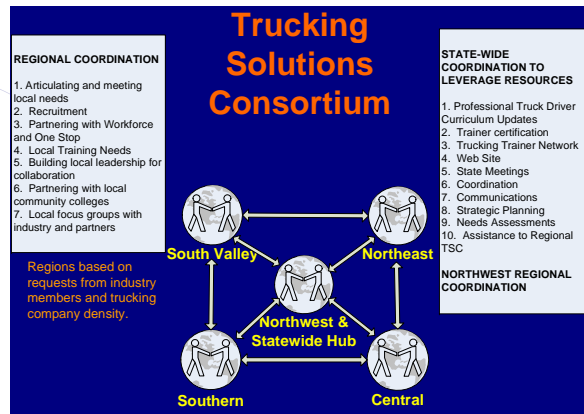

TRANSPORTATION CUSTOMER SERVICE

Trucking businesses can send their employees to this college accredited program customized for the trucking industry. Participants will develop essential customer service skills and approach required when drivers are the interface with customers.

TRAIN THE TRAINER: PROFESSIONAL TRUCK DRIVER CERTIFICATION:

This unique trainer development program coaches and models the best practices in adult learning and technical training. The Train the Trainer is one full week of training chocked full of practice skills, tricks and techniques to improve training and learner retention. This course also certifies trainers to use the Professional Truck Driver Certification (PTDC) Series curriculum. The PTDC is a college accredited four class series that prepares new drivers for their CDL and beyond with Customer Service and on-site "finishing school."

PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT TRAINING SERIES:

This new series of 7 separate one-day seminars is designed to develop trainers, leaders, and human resource professionals in developing employees, building a proactive culture, and motivating improved performance. Seminars will be available one per quarter.

TRUCKING BUSINESS MANAGEMENT:

This class is offered for business leaders to optimize business operations. Under development, this course will target financial management and resource allocation. Participants will build a business plan and analyze their own businesses for potential savings and growth opportunities.

TUITION MONEY: \$200,000 for loans and scholarships for potential truck drivers to attend Professional Truck Driver Certification and earn their CDLs at Clackamas College and IITR.
